Conditions appropriately managed by referral to the Emergency Department include conditions such as: Epistaxis nose bleed Hearing loss Injuries to the ears Injuries to the head and neck area Foreign bodies in ears, nose or throat Facial fractures Burns involving the nose ears and mouth Paralysis of the face Sinus disorders Dizziness Compromised upper airway Difficulty swallowing Lumps in the neck, throat Medical Staff The ENT Emergency medical staff consists of attending physicians, ENT residents, nursing staff and ancillary personnel.
